3. 🇮🇪 WEF members are drawn from all walks of life but can be split into 2 separate areas. The WEF calls the first category “people” and the 2nd one “agenda contributors”. 🇮🇪 has in excess of 65 members. In this 📌 I’m just going to concentrate on the most recognisable names.

4. There are also many “agenda contributors” which I will cover in 2 separate threads. They are people who write articles or do research for the WEF site. Sometimes there is a crossover between "people" and "contributors". Many of the agenda contributor names will be unfamiliar.

5. It also makes a lot of sense to cross reference a name with the WEF partners list. For example there may be a name which is unfamiliar who works for a massive corporation such as a bank. They could well be a WEF partner.


