

The easiest way of doing this was appointing influential figures within Universities over many years to get the message out.

5. I have already written a thread on the number of UK politicians who are members of the WEF which numbers 21. Its quite staggering to see that there are a hundred times that number dotted across the UK in 🇬🇧 universities.

8. What is interesting is that most of those universities with the highest funding also have very high numbers of WEF members in most instances. I know correlation doesn't equal causation but it is an interesting point nonetheless.

9. Here's how I tracked down the names of the WEF members within the universities. It's not rocket science. The first thing you need to do is go the World Economic Forum site and click on the magnifying glass on the top left of the screen.

11. Both "university of bristol" and "agenda contributor" will appear in bold writing in the results. You will then have a comprehensive list of academics from that particular university who are on the WEF books.

It will work for any university.

12. What becomes more apparent is that these academics come from every walk of life. The end goal is UN Agenda 2030.

Expect to come across experts in the area of law, climate change, nutrition, artificial intelligence, epidemiologists, mathematicians, economists etc.

13. Whatever discipline you can think of the WEF has it covered. Every article that these agenda contributors contribute or appearances they make in the media is done with the sole aim of pushing the WEF agenda.

No doubt they get compensated handsomely for it as well.

14. When you examine it more closely you can see that 37 of the UK's universities have also got funding from BMGF. The single biggest grant was for \$79 million for Imperial College London which has also received 72 grants in total.

15. I don't have the space to go through them all but all of them are documented in the 4 spread sheets. I'm only going to deal with the ones who have received funding of more than \$10m.

The numbers in the parentheses after are the amount of WEF members from that University
