- 5. She works on algorithmic criticism, developing methods to prevent gender bias in Artificial Intelligence.

- 6. ICDA was set up by Science Foundation Ireland (SFI) and in its 2015 annual report on page 26 it says
- "A key objective of Agenda 2020 was to establish a cohort of world-leading, large-scale SFI Research Centres to provide significant economic and societal impact for Ireland"
- 7. In the same report on page 29 it says

"In addition, funding has been secured from the Wellcome Trust, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and other philanthropic sources"

Finally on page 31 of the report it says "Three SFI-Pfizer Biotherapeutics..

In praise of Stephen Donnelly

Amidall the posturing at this week's meetings between the Oireachtas committee on finance and the mainbank executives, Stephen Donnelly, the Independent TD for Wicklow and East Carlow, stood out for his ability to cut to the chase.

More than once the former McKinsey consultant told bankers that mortgage arrears were a symptom not the problem. He said for a large cohort of the near 100,000 who were behind in their mortgage payments by 90 days or more, the debts were simply unsustainable, regardless of the forbearance measures offered by the banks.

He also, rightly, highlighted how between 60 per cent and 85 per cent of the so-called solutions being offered to customers would result in them actually repaying more by the time the loan is paid off. He asked PTSB chief



executive Jeremy Masding if he stood over a decision by the bank against a couple that would have the effect of them being forced to default on a loan that is funding college studies in favour of repaying their mortgage. After a brief pause, Masding agreed with the decision.

Donnelly told Masding this was "deeply disappointing", and such decisions might resolve the bank's problems but would be to the "cost of Irish citizens and economic recovery of this country".

It's not easy to make a mark with so many voices over 13 hours of hearings. Donnelly was one of the few committee members to standout.
